John Cardinal Dearden told Archdiocesan Development Fund (ADF) workers:

"The fact that the 1968 ADF grants are still being spent simply means that requests were not approved until recently and we are still drawing upon the 1968 fund. Nothing has been added to it.

"Each year's ADF has its own identity... The 1969 ADF, for example, was announced as being for the support of some of our schools that financially were in difficult straits. We knew we could not help them all but we wanted to help as many as we could. The funds realized... something in the round amount of \$600,000... were allocated to these schools and the money has been given to keep many of them going.

"Not all our schools are able financially to survive. The ADF multiplied many times over would not be enough to keep all our schools going. Let's be realistic about it: There is just not the amount of money available in the ADF.

"What about the 1970 ADF? What are we thinking about here? We have our basic need for a million dollars, in round numbers, to be used for on-going programs of the Archdiocese. What we realize beyond that (which is not designated for other purposes) we want to assign to a very specific purpose,

and that is to improve education, so far as we can, for the disadvantaged in our community."

John Cardinal Dearden told Archdiocesan Development Fund workers:

"Concerning the 1968 ADF special collection for urban purposes, it is not easy to give away a million dollars prudently and sanely. To do this it seemed important to bring together a committee of representative persons... to make recommendations.

"Commonly I followed the recommendations that were made to me, because I recognized the competence of the committee - and a person does not ask responsible people to come together to give many hours of their time to evaluate things and then disregard their advice.

"On the other hand, there were a few things I had reservations about and I communicated the reservations to the committee. In several instances I sent matters back and asked to have them reappraised. I wanted them to take a second look and be convinced that what they were recommending they were prepared to stand by. This they did.

"In only one or two instances did I say categorically, for reasons of principle, that I did not feel grants could be approved."

Priests Bring

Family Films Back Downtown

Two priests have taken over one of Detroit's finest theaters, the Music Hall at 350 Madison Ave., to bring family movies back downtown. Prices will be \$1.50 for adults and 75 cents for children and retirees at daily performances at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m.

"We figure there is money in satisfying the desire of many thousands," said Father John E. Nader, C.S.Sp., pastor of St. Mary's at St. Antoine and Monroe. "The profits, of course, will go entirely to the poor and needy of our parishes," added Father Richard J. Ward, of St. Aloysius Parish, 1234 Washington Blvd.

There will be four weeks of "taste-testing" to determine what kind of films families want to see. Starting May 15, two W.C. Fields masterpieces will be shown, 'The Bank Dick' and 'Never Give a Sucker an Even Break'. 'Romeo and Juliet' will open May 22 and 'Thoroughly Modern Millie' May 29. On June 5, 'African Safari' and Walt Disney's 'Underwater Mysteries' will be shown.

"We will poll the audience on likes and dislikes," Father Nader said. "They will tell us what they want to see and we will get it—old movie or the latest."
